

Doctorate in Sociology Programs

- Doctorate in Philosophy (Ph.D.)
- Ph.D. programs in Sociology are research based
- Research topic of choice has a big influence on what you learn and the types of courses you take
 - Experience depends heavily on area of interest and course of study
- Curriculum is likely to include courses centered on research practices and methodology
- Dissertation required
- Trains future scholars for skills in the discipline of sociology
- Acquire advanced knowledge of sociological theory and research in chosen area
- Graduates pursue research and/or post-secondary teaching positions
- Roughly takes four-eight years to complete
